OUTDOOR BURNING REGULATIONS



BEFORE YOU BURN CALL 541-595-2288

In an Emergency Dial 9.1.1.

FAILURE TO HAVE A COPY OF THE OUTDOOR BURNING REGULATIONS AT THE BURNING SITE, OR FAILURE TO FOLLOW THESE REQUIREMENTS, WILL BE A VIOLATION OF THE FIRE CODE.

GENERAL BURN REGULATIONS

- Call 541-595-2288 prior to burning to find out if burning is allowed.
- Burning will be allowed only when conditions warrant and when burning is open throughout Deschutes County.
- Current burn regulations must be on site while burning. (This document)
- You must have legal control of the property, or permission of the property owner where burning is conducted.
- The ground shall be clear of combustible material for 10 feet outside of the fire in all directions.
- No burning when temperatures exceed 90 degrees.
- No burning when winds exceed 10 mph.
- Maintain minimum distances of 25 ft from all structures.
- Keep adequate firefighting equipment on hand at all times while burning. (Hose or Fire Extinguisher, Shovel)
- All open burning must be 100% completely extinguished by sundown or before leaving unattended. Anyone burning after sundown or leaving a fire unattended may be charged for suppression costs as a result.
- Fires shall be attended at <u>ALL</u> times by a responsible person.
- If fires get out of control, CALL 911 IMMEDIATELY!

RESIDENTIAL OPEN BURNING

- Fires should be at least 50 ft. away from all structures. Fires that are at least 50 ft. away from structures may have a maximum size of 6 ft. in diameter and 6 ft. in height.
- Fires within 25 ft. to 50 ft. of a structure shall be limited in size to 3 ft. in diameter and 2 ft. in height.
- No fire shall be allowed closer than 25 ft. to any structure.
- All general burn regulations apply in addition to the rules above.

PROHIBITED MATERIAL

(Applies to all outdoor burning)

- Garbage
- Plastic
- Wire Insulation
- Petroleum based products
- Rubber
- Animal Waste
- Food Service Waste
- Industrial Waste
- Commercial Waste

DEFENSIBLE SPACE

Do you have at least 30 ft. of space surrounding your home that is **Lean, Clean and Green?**

The objective of Survivable Space is to reduce the wildfire threat to your home by changing the characteristics of the flammable vegetation.

Lean – prune shrubs and cut back trees branches, especially within 15 feet of your chimney.

Clean – Remove all dead plant material from around your home; this includes dead leaves, dry vegetation and even stacked firewood.

Green – Plant fire-resistant vegetation that is healthy and green throughout the year.

SURVIVABLE SPACE PROVIDES A SAFETY ZONE AROUND YOUR HOME.
